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PROSPECTUS.

This institution is conducted by the Fathers of the Society of Jesus.

It is a boarding and day College, founded in 1877, to comply with the earnest desire of many of the Catholic families in New Mexico. Half-Boarders are also admitted. They spend the day in the College and are dismissed towards the evening, thus enjoying almost all the advantages of a domestic as well as collegial education.

The course of instruction is such as to meet the special requirements of this Territory.

It comprises two distinct departments.

The first, or preparatory department, is for younger pupils. It is purely elementary, and may last from one to two or more years according to the age, talent and proficiency of the students. Primary lessons in English and in Spanish, Writing, Spelling and Arithmetic, are taught in this Department.

The second or higher Department is intended to prepare the scholars for a commercial career. It embraces lessons in English and Spanish composition, a full course of Arithmetic, Book-keeping and Elements of History and Geography. Algebra, Geometry and Natural Philosophy may be added to this course for such pupils as should be found sufficiently well trained in the lower branches.

A class of Latin has also been established in the College. It has been attended with the greatest success; and forms only an optional branch of study, without any extra charge.

Pupils may learn, besides, Music, either vocal or instrumental, of Piano or Organ.

The formation of both heart and mind being the basis of a true Christian education, the Directors deem it their imperious duty to bear their utmost attention on the moral and religious culture of the youth committed to their care. But although the College be conducted on Catholic principles, no undue influence will ever be exerted to induce non-catholic students to a change of religious belief.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

The scholastic year consists of but one session, beginning, until some new arrangement, on the third Monday of October, and closing on the 16th of August, on which day a public Examination of the classes and a Solemn Award of Prizes will be held.

Parents and guardians cannot be too earnestly recommended to send their sons or wards to College at the very opening of the session. Any delay is generally the cause of no little inconveniences and tends to retard the progress of the pupils at a time which is most favorable to their application to study.

Besides a few days of semi-annual recess about Christmas and Easter, the following are also ordinary holidays:—All the holy days of obligation—Every Thursday—The feasts of St. Joseph and St. Aloysius—Thanksgiving Day, Washington's birthday and the Fourth of July.

Boarders, whose parents do not reside at great distance will be allowed to spend a day with them once every month, and generally on the first Thursday. But they should always be returned to the College before night, and never again taken away on sport on other days.

Catholic day-scholars are required to hear Mass in the College chapel every Sunday and all other holy day of obligation, and to attend religious instruction on Sunday afternoons.

To promote the advancement and good behavior of the students, weekly marks showing their conduct, application and proficiency are publicly read to them. A monthly bulletin will state the result of these marks; and parents are requested to demand it from their sons at the beginning of each month.

Motives of Religion and self-respect being habitually appealed to, no need has been experienced of frequent or severe punishment.

Flagrant offences, such as are detrimental to the reputation of the College, or are obstructive to the good of other pupils, are grounds for expulsion.

For faults of ordinary occurrence—such as tardy arrival, failure in recitations, or minor instances of misconduct—detention after school, some lines to be copied or to be committed to memory, privation of monthly vacation for the Boarders, and low weekly marks, are usually found sufficient penalty.

The efforts of teachers and prefects will be much facilitated if the cooperation of parents can be secured.

Parents are, therefore, earnestly requested to insist upon the regular and punctual attendance of their children to school; to notify the teacher speedily in case of detention or withdrawal; to exact regularly the monthly bulletin; to attend to such notifications as may be sent by the teacher in order to inform them of unexplained absence, of bad lessons, or of unsatisfactory deportment; and not to take the pupils out of College when there be no urgent necessity.

Prospecto.

Esta institucion está dirigida por los Padres de la Compañía de Jesús.

Es á la vez un Colegio para internos y externos, fundado en 1877 para corresponder á los deseos de muchas familias Católicas de Nuevo Méjico.

Se admiten tambien medio-pensionistas, quienes despues de haber pasado el dia en el Colegio, vuelven al anochecer á sus casas, gozando de este modo de casi todas las ventajas de una educacion colegial y doméstica.

Las asignaturas que se cursan son conformes á las exigencias del Territorio, y se dividen en dos clases.

La primera, ó clase preparatoria, que se compone de los más niños, es puramente elemental, y puede durar uno, dos ó más años segun la edad, el talento y el aprovechamiento de los alumnos. Las asignaturas propias de esta clase son los principios de lengua Inglesa y Castellana, Deletrear, Escritura y Aritmética.

La segunda Clase ó más elevada tiende á preparar los alumnos para una carrera comercial, y abraza ejercicios de composicion en Inglés y en Castellano; un curso completo de Aritmética; la Teneduría de Libros; los Elementos de Historia y de Geografía. A dichas asignaturas pueden añadirse el Algebra, la Geometría y la Física para aquellos alumnos los cuales se hallaren bastante bien versados en los ramos inferiores.

Establecióse tambien en el Colegio una clase de Latin, cuyo éxito ha sido muy feliz; pero esta queda á la opcion de quien lo deseare, sin ninguna pension particular.

Se dan ademas lecciones de música Vocal ó Instrumental de Piano ú Organo.

Siendo la formacion del corazon y de la inteligencia la única base de una educacion verdaderamente Cristiana, es un imperioso deber de los Directores atender con el mayor esmero á la cultura moral y religiosa de los jóvenes confiados á sus cuidados. Pero si bien el Colegio estriba sobre principios Católicos, jamás se ejercerá el menor influjo indebido sobre los alumnos que no sean Católicos, para inducirlos á que muden de creencias religiosas.

RECLAMENTO GENERAL.

El año escolástico consta de diez meses, empezando, hasta nuevo arreglo, el tercer Lunes de Octubre, y terminándose el diez y seis de Agosto, con el Exámen Público de cada una de las Clases, y la Solemne Distribucion de Premios.

Se suplica muy encarecidamente á los Padres y Tutores enviar sus hijos al Colegio desde la apertura de las Escuelas. Toda dilacion causa por lo general graves inconvenientes, y es un obstáculo para el aprovechamiento de los niños en un tiempo que contribuye eficazmente á su aplicacion.

Además de pocos dias de vacacion concedidos en las dos épocas del año de Navidad y Pascua, son asimismo dias ordinarios de fiesta: Todos los de obligacion: Los Jueves: Los dias de S. José y de S. Luis de Gonzaga: El dia de accion de gracias: El aniversario del nacimiento de Washington: El dia cuatro de Julio.

Se permite á los alumnos internos, cuyos Padres no viven muy lejos, pasar una vez al mes un dia en su compañía, el cual será de ordinario el primer Jueves. Pero se les exige siempre que regresen al Colegio antes de la noche, y no vuelvan á salir en los demás dias por motivo de diversion.

Los alumnos externos deben asistir á la Misa en la Capilla del Colegio todos los Domingos y otros dias de precepto, y á las instrucciones del Catecismo los Domingos en la tarde.

Para promover el adelanto y buena conducta de los alumnos se les leen públicamente cada semana las notas que muestran su conducta, su aplicacion y aprovechamiento; y el resultado de dichas notas será atestiguado por un boletin enviado todos los meses á los Padres, á quienes se ruega que lo exijan de sus hijos al principio de cada mes.

Sirviéndose el Colegio de motivos de religion y propio decoro, no ha habido necesidad de acudir á frecuentes ó severos castigos. Faltas graves que comprometen la reputacion del Colegio, ú obstan al bien de los alumnos, son motivos para ser expulsado.

En cuanto á los defectos que comunmente ocurren, como por ejemplo, llegar tarde; dar mal las lecciones; ú otras leves faltas de conducta, parece que basta castigarlos ó con el arresto despues de la escuela; ó con copiar ó aprender de memoria unos cuantos renglones; ó con privar á los internos de la vacacion de

costumbre del 1er Jueves del mes, ó con rebajar las notas de la semana.

La cooperacion de parte de los Parientes, contribuye en gran manera á facilitar los esfuerzos de los Maestros y Prefectos.

Por lo tanto se ruega con instancia á los Padres que cuiden de que sus hijos vengan puntual y regularmente á la escuela: que avisen pronto al Profesor en caso de que no los envien ó los saquen de ella; que exijan regularmente el boletin de cada mes: que se hagan cargo de las notas enviadas por el Profesor para informarles de una ausencia sin razon, ó de las malas lecciones, y mal comportamiento; y que no saquen del Colegio á los alumnos sin una urgente necesidad.
