

PROSPECTUS.

This institution, conducted by the Fathers of the Society of Jesus, was founded by them in 1877.

It is intended for Boarders, Half-Boarders and Day Scholars.

The course of studies is adapted to the special requirements of this part of the country, and comprises two Departments.

The first, or Preparatory Department, designed for younger pupils, is merely elementary, affording primary lessons in English and Spanish, Writing, Spelling, and Arithmetic. It may last from one to three or more years, according to the age, talent and proficiency of the pupils.

The Second, or Higher Department, is directed to impart to the students a thorough commercial education, both in English and Spanish. It embraces lessons in Grammar and composition, a full course of intellectual and practical Arithmetic, Book-keeping, Elocution, History of the United States, Geography, Algebra and Rhetoric. Pupils, who, being well grounded in these branches, may show a desire and disposition for higher attainments, will be given ample opportunity for the study of Geometry, Geology, Astronomy, and Mental and Natural Philosophy, for which latter study a Cabinet of Physics and Chemistry was begun in the College during the scholastic year of 1879-80.

A Classical Department, which the Directors aim at gradually developing into a full and general plan of studies, forms now an optional part of the system of instruction. Whilst it prepares youth for the study of the learned professions, it omits almost none of the principal branches of the Commercial Course.

Music lessons, either vocal or instrumental—on the Piano, Organ, or Brass Instruments—will be given to those desiring them, and will form extra charges.

The formation of both mind and heart being of supreme importance for the proper training of youth, the Directors shall bestow their utmost attention on the moral and religious culture of students committed to their care; and although the College be conducted on Catholic principles, no undue influence is ever exerted on non-catholic pupils to induce them to a change of religious belief.

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

Until some new arrangement be made, the scholastic year will begin on the last Monday of October, and close on the 15th of August, on which day a public Award of Prizes will be held.

Parents and guardians cannot be too earnestly recommended to send their sons or wards to the College at the very opening of the session. Any delay is generally the cause of considerable inconvenience and tends to retard the progress of the pupils at a time which is most favorable for application to study.

Besides a few days of semi-annual recess at Christmas and Easter, the following are also ordinary holidays:—All the holy-days of obligation—Every Thursday—The feasts of St. Joseph and St. Aloysius—Thanksgiving Day—Washington's birthday and the Fourth of July.

Boarders, whose parents or guardians reside in town, will be allowed to spend a day at home once every month, generally on the first Thursday. But they should always return to the College before 5 p. m., during the winter season, and before 7 p. m., during the summer season. On no other occasion will they be permitted to go out of the College without very urgent reasons.

Half-Boarders study, dine and recreate with the Boarders. They should come to the College even on Sundays and all ordinary holidays, and will be dismissed towards the evening.

Catholic Day Scholars are required to hear Mass in the College chapel every Sunday and all other holy-days of obligation, and to attend religious instruction on Sunday afternoons.

To promote the advancement and good behavior of the students, weekly marks showing their conduct, application and proficiency will be publicly read in each class, and their result will be stated in the Bulletin, which parents are requested to demand from their sons at the beginning of every month.

Motives of Religion and self respect being habitually appealed to, no need has been experienced of frequent and severe punishment.

Flagrant offences, such as are detrimental to the reputation of the College, or are obstructive to the good of other pupils, are grounds for expulsion.

For faults of ordinary occurrence—such as tardy arrival, failure in recitations, or minor instances of misconduct—detention after school, some lines to be copied or committed to memory, privation of monthly vacation for Boarders, and low weekly marks, are usually found sufficient penalty.

The efforts of Teachers and Prefects will be much facilitated if the cooperation of parents can be secured.

Parents are, therefore, earnestly requested to insist upon the regular and punctual attendance of their children at school; to notify the Teacher speedily in case of detention or withdrawal; to exact regularly the monthly Bulletin; to attend to such no-

tifications as may be sent by the Directors to inform them of unexplained absence, bad lessons, or unsatisfactory deportment, and not to take the pupils out of the College without an imperative necessity.

Each Boarder should be supplied with sufficient clothing, linen, bed-clothes, a mattress, blankets, etc.

Tuition for Day Scholars, from one to three dollars per month. They may be admitted gratuitously, if desired.

Books, stationery and other minor articles may be had at the College at the lowest prices of retail dealers.

N. B. No advances will be made by the Institution for clothing, pocket-money, society fees, postage, or other expenses of the students. If parents, therefore, desire that the College procure any articles for their sons, a sum sufficient to meet the expense should be deposited with the Treasurer.

PROSPECTO.

El Colegio de Las Vegas, dirigido por los Padres de la Compañía de Jesus, fué fundado por ellos en 1877.

Además de internos y externos se reciben tambien medio-internos.

Los estudios están adaptados á las exigencias del Territorio y se dividen en dos Cursos.

El primero, ó Curso Preparatorio, que se compone de los más niños, es puramente elemental, comprendiendo los principios de las lenguas Inglesa y Castellana, Caligrafía y Aritmética. Puede durar de uno á tres ó más años, segun la edad, el talento y el aprovechamiento de los muchachos.

El segundo Curso está destinado á dar á los alumnos una entera y esmerada instrucción comercial en Inglés y Castellano. Abraza las lecciones de Gramática y Composición en las dos lenguas, un curso completo de Aritmética, Teneduría de Libros, Declamación, Historia de los Estados Unidos, Geografía, Algebra y Retórica. A estas asignaturas se podrán añadir las de Geometría, Astronomía, Geología, Física y Química, para los alumnos que, estando bien fundados en los ramos inferiores, mostraren deseos y aptitud para estudios más elevados.

Para facilitar el estudio de la Física y Química se empezó á

establecer, durante el año de 1879-80, un Gabinete y Laboratorio correspondientes á estas ciencias.

Pertenece además al plan de enseñanza actual un curso de estudios clásicos, que por ahora es libre, y que los Directores miran á desarrollar y generalizar con el tiempo para todos los alumnos. Al paso que predispone los jóvenes al estudio de las profesiones liberales, este curso no omite ninguno de los ramos principales de la enseñanza comercial.

Se dan además lecciones de música Vocal y de Piano ú Organo, ú otro instrumento de charanga.

Siendo la formacion del corazon y de la inteligencia la única base de una buena y sana educacion, es un imperioso deber de los Directores atender con el mayor esmero á la cultura moral y religiosa de los jóvenes confiados á sus cuidados. Pero, si bien el Colegio estriba sobre principios Católicos, no se ejercerá ningun influjo indebido sobre los alumnos que no sean Católicos, para que muden de creencias religiosas.



RECLAMENTO GENERAL.

El año escolástico consta de diez meses, empezando, hasta nuevo arreglo, el último Lunes de Octubre, y terminándose el quince de Agosto con la solemne Distribucion de Premios.

Se suplica muy encarecidamente á los Padres y Tutores que envien á sus hijos al Colegio desde la apertura de las Escuelas. Toda dilacion causa por lo general graves inconvenientes, y es un obstáculo para el aprovechamiento de los niños en un tiempo que es el más favorable para aplicarse seriamente al estudio.

Además de pocos días de vacacion, concedidos en las dos épocas de Navidad y Pascua, son asimismo días ordinarios de fiesta: Todos los de obligacion: Los Jueves: Los días de S. José y de S. Luis de Gonzaga: El día de accion de gracias: El aniversario del nacimiento de Washington: El día cuatro de Julio.

Se permite á los alumnos internos, cuyos padres ó tutores no viven lejos, pasar un dia en su compagnía una vez al mes, que será de ordinario el primer Jueves. Pero se les exige siempre que regresen al Colegio antes de las 5 P. M. en el invierno, y de las 7 en el verano. En ninguna otra ocasion se les permitirá salir sin motivos de verdadera urgencia.

Los medio-internos estudian, comen y pasan los recreos con los internos. Deben venir al Colegio tambien los Domingos y demás fiestas ordinarias, y vuelven á sus casas hacia el anochecer.

Los alumnos externos Católicos deben asistir á la Misa en la Capilla del Colegio todos los Domingos y otros dias de precepto, y á las instrucciones del Catecismo los Domingos por la tarde.

Para promover el adelanto y buena conducta de los alumnos se les leen públicamente cada semana las notas que muestran su conducta, su aplicacion y aprovechamiento; y el resultado de dichas notas será atestiguado por un boletin, que los padres deben exigir de sus hijos al principio de cada mes.

Sirviéndose el Colegio de motivos de religion y decoro personal, no ha habido necesidad de acudir á frecuentes ó severos castigos. Las faltas graves que comprometieren la reputacion del Colegio, ú obstaren al bien de los demás alumnos, son motivos para ser expulsado.

En cuanto á las faltas más ordinarias, como de llegar tarde, no saber las lecciones, ú otras igualmente lijeras, bastará castigarlas, sea deteniendo á los muchachos despues de la escuela, sea mandándoles copiar ó aprender de memoria unas cuantas líneas de sus libros, ó privándolos, si son internos, de la salida del primer Jueves del mes, ó finalmente rebajando las notas de la semana.

La cooperacion de los padres y tutores, contribuye en gran manera á facilitar los esfuerzos de los Maestros y Prefectos.

Por lo tanto se ruega con instancia á los padres que cuiden de que sus hijos vengan puntual y regularmente á la escuela;

que avisen pronto al Profesor en caso de que los detengan ó los saquen; que exijan regularmente el boletin de cada mes; que se hagan cargo de las notas enviadas por los Directores para informarles de ausencias no motivadas, ó de malas lecciones, y mal comportamiento; y que no saquen del Colegio á los alumnos sin una imperiosa necesidad.
