When all of a sudden Our door opened wide And Patron Saint Put-It-Off ambled inside.


His spirit was careless, His manner was mellow, But summoning effort he started to bellow:

His mesage delivered, he vanished from sight, But we heard him laughing outside in the night:


"Your teachers have begged you, so just do our best... Happy Finals to All, And to All, a good test."




